Examples	Syllable Type and Description
cat	Closed Syllable
chop trip jump	This type of syllable has only one vowel, and ends with at least one consonant.
crush	Short vowel sound
Ι	Open Syllable
he try so	This type of syllable ends with a single vowel, or IS a single vowel.
apron	Long vowel sound
home ape like	<u>V-C-E Syllable</u> This type of syllable has a vowel, followed by a consonant, followed by "e".
smoke	The first vowel is long, and the final e is silent.
tab le thim ble shut tle lit tle drib ble	<u>L-E Syllable</u> This type of syllable has a consonant followed by "le", and occurs at the end of a word. The e is silent so only the consonant and "l" are heard.
first	R-controlled Syllable
car nurse	This type of syllable has a vowel combined with the letter "r".
worth worker	The vowel is neither short nor long and is either like "er" "or" or "ar".
street moon	Double-Vowel Syllable
boat bean	This type of syllable has two vowels side-by-side.
head great	The vowel combination may have one of several different sounds (as in the last three examples).
